

My Diagnosis, My Foundation

- Diagnosed at 18 months old
- Memories
 - As a toddler, my family would take turns doing manual CPT. One time I was crying during it and my uncle made a comment that it wasn't that bad- my Pappaw did the same to him and my uncle made him stop after 1 minute
 - As a child, my mother would tell me my Vest was like Xena the Warrior Princess's body armor to encourage compliance with therapies
 - Overhearing a phone call about my parents being forced to legally separate so I could keep my Medicaid coverage
- Challenges
 - Sleepovers with friends, not an excuse not to do therapy/medications
 - Missing days to weeks of school due to hospitalizations
 - Being treated differently
- Resilience, not limitations!




Turning My Experience into Purpose

- Combined perspective- patient and provider








Representation Matters
